

GILA COUNTY

Gila County is a diverse geographical region of 4,748 square miles with approximately 52,000 residents.

There are several communities within Gila County with the largest being Globe and Payson. The Gila County Sheriff's Office has offices in both of these cities and towns with substations in Young and Roosevelt.

Gila County's terrain ranges from high mountains to low desert, all of which can be reached by vehicle within a matter of a few hours.

Gila County attracts many people for its wide range of recreational activities, including: fishing, boating, trail riding, hiking, skiing, hunting, biking, rock climbing, and many more. You can also visit several historical sites such as the Tonto Natural Bridge, Tonto National Monument, Beshba-Gawaah Museum, Zane Grey Museum, and many more.

Gila County is the home to the Tonto National Forest, Roosevelt Lake, the Mogollon Rim and several other lakes and recreational areas..

Within Gila County are three major Indian Reservations, the San Carlos Apache Reservation, the White Mountain Apache Reservation, and the Tonto Apache Reservation, all with their own Casino's, Hotels and other recreational activities.

Gila County is a growing community that is fast becoming a favorite residential community as it is centrally located in Arizona and is the gateway to many other well known locations in Arizona.

THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE

Gila County was established 125 years ago in 1881. Approximately 160 people currently work for the Sheriff's Office including certified Deputies, Detention Officers, 9-1-1 Radio Dispatchers, and support staff.

SERVICES PROVIDED

The Sheriff's Office provides services to all of Gila County. These activities include general law and traffic enforcement, criminal investigations, SRO/DARE, K-9, the Gila County Narcotics, Gang and Violent Crime Task Force, Civil Process, Watercraft Patrol, Detention, Dive Team, Horse Patrol, Search and Rescue, Reserves, the Payson Posse, and the Sheriff's Reserve Posse.

MAJOR JOB DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE

Performs law enforcement patrol activities in assigned areas; enforces laws; protects life and property; detects criminal behavior; arrests violators; subdues resisting offenders using force where appropriate, including deadly force; transports; investigates cases; performs surveillance; crowd control; execution of writs, subpoenas and court orders; prepares reports; seizes and processes evidence; assist distressed persons; direct traffic; administer first aid; mediate disputes; protect crime and traffic scenes; conduct interviews; measure and diagram crime and traffic collision scenes; assist and refer mentally ill, indigent, and other persons in need; perform evacuations; bodily move persons, vehicles and other property from unsafe locations; maintains the jail; conducts search and rescue operations.

- 21 years of age at time of entering academy
- US citizen
- ability to become certified law enforcement officer by AzPOST
- pass a background screen
- successfully complete complete psychological, polygraph, and medical examination
- Current and valid Arizona Driver's License
