



ORDINANCE NO. 98-3
REVISED February 3, 2004

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF GILA PROVIDING FOR THE REMOVAL OF MOTOR VEHICLES FROM COUNTY MAINTAINED STREETS DURING SNOW REMOVAL SEASON; AND FOR CITATIONS TO BE ISSUED BY THE GILA COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, the Gila County Board of Supervisors, pursuant to A.R.S. section 11-251 (4), may lay out, maintain, control, and manage public roads within the County; and

WHEREAS, the Gila County Board of Supervisors, pursuant to A.R.S. 11-251 (31), may make and enforce all local, police, sanitation, and other regulations not in conflict with general law; and

WHEREAS, the Gila County Board of Supervisors, pursuant to A.R.S. section 11-251.05, may adopt all ordinances necessary or proper to carry out the duties, responsibilities, and functions of the County; and

WHEREAS, a responsibility of the Gila County Road Department, after a snow fall, is to clear those County highways and roads used by large numbers of residents, those that service school bus routes, and those that provide major access for emergency vehicles; and

WHEREAS, motor vehicles parked in the streets become a hazard, both to the county snow removal equipment and to others.


THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors of Gila County, Arizona, does hereby ordain as follows:



1. Each year between November 1st and April 1st, inclusive, no motor vehicle shall stop, park or be left standing, weather attended or unattended, on the paved or main traveled part of the streets so as to prevent snow removal by Gila County equipment. Any motor vehicle parked in a manner that presents an obstacle to efficient snow removal operations may be cited by the Sheriff's Department. In those areas where notice of this ordinance is posted, vehicles may be towed away and stored at the owner's expense. This section shall not apply to those motor vehicles stopped or parked in a designated parking space.


2. Violation of this ordinance shall be a fine of \$50.00.


