**RESOLUTION NO. 11-04-05**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE GILA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS CALLING UPON THE ARIZONA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO INSTALL A SIGNALIZED PEDESTRIAN CROSSWALK ADJACENT TO THE GLOBE HIGH SCHOOL, OR AT A MINIMUM, INSTALL THE "HAWK SYSTEM" OF FLASHING RED LIGHTS OPERABLE BY PEDESTRIANS.**

**WHEREAS**, the safety of the children of Globe has been compromised by the inaction of the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) to a known hazard for over twenty (20) years; and

**WHEREAS**, signal lights or pedestrian signal lights are warranted for the crosswalk based on the Federal Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD); and

**WHEREAS**, in a letter to the Globe Unified School District ADOT advises simply that the school children should "choose adequate gaps in traffic for their crossings"; and

**WHEREAS**, based upon the documented increase in vehicular traffic on U.S. 60 at this location, there are no "adequate gaps in traffic" for school children crossings.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that we, the Gila County Board of Supervisors, do hereby call upon ADOT to install signalized pedestrian crossings, or, at a minimum, install the "HAWK System" of flashing red lights operable by pedestrians, in order to create adequate gaps in traffic for their safe crossing, forthwith and prior to the death or serious physical injury to Globe students or citizens at this known dangerous location.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this Resolution and supporting documentation be forwarded to the State Engineer.

**PASSED AND ADOPTED** this 5<sup>th</sup> day of April 2011, at Globe, Gila County, Arizona


