On January 15, 2015, Arizona became the first state in the nation to pass a law requiring high school students to pass a civics exam before they can graduate, beginning in 2016-2017. The proposal requires high school students to correctly answer 60 of 100 questions on the civics portion of the U.S. citizenship test.
