**Description:** The C-SPAN Teacher Fellowship is for educators who have experience using C-SPAN's resources in the classroom and can demonstrate innovative methods of incorporating C-SPAN programs into educational experiences. The four-week fellowship is held during the summer in the C-SPAN offices in Washington, DC. In addition, C-SPAN Teacher Fellows may participate in C-SPAN's Summer Educators' Conference, which brings together middle and high school educators from around the country to learn more about C-SPAN and how to effectively integrate C-SPAN's online resources into their instruction.

Eligible applicants are social studies teachers in grades 6 through 12. Applications must be submitted online.

**Description:** NWEA offers Educators for Equity Grants that strive to foster academic growth among underserved students, including those that are economically disadvantaged and English language learners. Proposed programs should be equity-focused, evidence-based, culturally relevant to students served, and explicitly designed to improve academic opportunities and outcomes.

Eligible applicants are US public schools or schools and districts serving prekindergarten through grade 12. Faith-based schools that accept students of all beliefs and backgrounds may apply. Applications must be submitted using the online system.

**Description:** The Arizona Sports and Tourism Authority awards Quick Grants to support youth and amateur sports programs, with emphasis on small "quick" projects to meet community needs. Funding considerations include need, benefit to a local school or community, and program sustainability. Grant requests are accepted for up to two-thirds of total project cost. Previous grant recipients may reapply but are given a lower priority. There is a limit of one grant per year per organization. All projects must take place in Maricopa County.

Eligible applicants are school districts, municipalities, agencies, and other public entities, and 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations located in and serving Maricopa County in Arizona. Funds are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis until expended for the fiscal year. The application can be accessed during funding periods and submitted following the application instructions.

**Description:** The ASM Foundation is committed to working with and supporting teachers through "Living in a Material World" kindergarten through grade 12 teacher grants. The ASM Materials Education Foundation sponsors 20 annual grants for teachers to bring the real world of material science into their classroom. The purpose of these grants is to enhance awareness of materials science and the role of materials scientists in society. Through the network of local chapters across the US, ASM members are willing to work closely with local teachers to develop and implement these lessons. A list of chapters is available on the website.

To apply for a grant, teachers should submit a proposal describing a hands-on, curriculum-based kindergarten through grade 12 project that enhances student awareness of the materials around them. Projects should involve student observation, teamwork, mathematics, and science skills. Applicants are encouraged to contact local ASM members through their local chapters for assistance in creating imaginative, original projects that other teachers will want to emulate. Applications must be submitted online.

**Description:** The Justin J. Watt Foundation offers support to middle schools that do not have sufficient funding for after school and athletic programs. The foundation offers Equipment Grants for after-school programs, such as athletic teams for grade 6 through 8. Examples of eligible items include uniforms with school name or numbers; safety equipment, such as helmets, pads, or mats; balls, bats, or nets; and storage equipment.

Eligible applicants are schools serving grades 6 through 8. For sports starting in March, April, or May, applications must be submitted before the 15th of November, January, or February. For sports starting in August, September, or October, applications must be submitted before the 15th of March, April, or May. For sports starting in November, December, January, or February, applications must be submitted before the 15th of August, September, or October. Applications must be submitted online.

Interested applicants must first submit a Letter of Interest; selected applicants are then invited to submit a full proposal. Letters may be submitted by email or postal mail.
